Dr. Vincent Hsu is the Hospital Epidemiologist and Executive Director for Infection Prevention at Florida Hospital in Orlando. He also serves as an Assistant Director for the Florida Hospital Internal Medicine Residency Program with faculty appointments from the Colleges of Medicine at Florida State University and the University of Central Florida. A graduate from the Loma Linda University School of Medicine, he completed his infectious disease training at the University of Southern California, and obtained a Master of Public Health at UCLA. He trained at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as an Epidemic Intelligence Officer studying outbreaks caused by respiratory and enteric viruses, participating in investigations into the 2001 anthrax attacks and 2003 SARS epidemic. He is board-certified in Infectious Disease and Preventive Medicine, and has published in several peer-reviewed journals. Having previously served as the Director for Continuing Medical Education and with current involvement in training medical residents, Dr. Hsu has a passion for healthcare professional education. Specific areas of interest include methods to improve vaccination rates, prevention of hospital-acquired infections, hospital biopreparedness, and strategies to improve patient safety.
