Randy Hartley is Chief Operating Officer (COO) for Nemours Children's Hospital, located in Lake Nona's Medical City in Southeast Orlando. As CEO, Hartley leads and integrates clinical support, operational support and administrative functions associated with the hospital ensuring they are focused on facilitating patient and family-centered care. He joined Nemours in May, 2011.

Hartley is a nationally recognized senior health services executive who brings extensive operational and leadership experience in a wide variety national and international health care settings. Before joining Nemours, Hartley served as Vice President, Operations at St. Vincent's Physician Enterprises in Jacksonville, Florida, where he led primary care and specialty physician practice operations and expanded market growth for a multi-hospital integrated system of care that included 45 locations and approximately 160 physicians. Prior to that, he served as Administrator/Chief Operating Officer for St. Luke's Hospital, a 313-bed acute care hospital, also in Jacksonville.

Hartley served our nation for more than 28 years in the U.S. Air Force retiring in the grade of Colonel in 2005. He served as a line officer for 8 years and then entered the hospital administration career field. During his federal career, he administered multiple community and regional referral hospitals and a tertiary care, graduate medical education-focused medical center. Additionally, he had extensive service as a medical planner world-wide with particular emphasis in the Middle East and Central Asia areas. He administered a Middle Eastern multi-national health care support system for 200,000 personnel from 34 coalition nations that shattered medical support benchmarks. Additionally, he served as the Air Force Surgeon General Consultant for Medical Emergency Preparedness, Disaster Management and Humanitarian Support Operations.

Hartley has a Bachelor of Arts from the Virginia Military Institute in Lexington, Virginia and a Master of Science in Business with an emphasis on Health Care Administration from the University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, Colorado.
